Financial Aid for Students

1 NO POVERTY



In Malaysia, there are three categories of income groups:

1.Top 20% (T20) - RM 10,960 and above

2.Middle 40% (M40) - RM 4,850 - RM 10,959

3.Bottom 40% (B40) - RM 4,849 and below

Various financial aids are made available for students from **bottom 40% household income** group to complete their studies. The aid is in the form of **rebates**, **education loan**, **scholarships**, and **bursary awards**.

University has collaborated with the following local and international healthcare providers to provide **full scholarships** for nursing students.

These scholarship covers up to **100**% of tuition fees for students pursuing undergraduate nursing programme at university.

Welfare and Zakat Trust Fund (TAZUoC)







Tabung Amanah Zakat & Kebajikan University of Cyberjaya (TAZUoC) is the university's welfare and Zakat Trust fund set up in 2007 to provide financial assistance for B40 students. The types of financial assistance provided are monthly living allowance, tuition fee, emergency help, medical assistance, funeral expenses, digital device, etc.

In 2022, a total of **RM 128,750** was distributed to **136 university students** for monthly living allowance and total of **RM 51,815.35** was distributed to **29 university students** for tuition fees.

Student Ambassador Programme

Student ambassador programme by student recruitment department provides UoC students the opportunity to study and earn part time. Work timings are flexible. Students can earn up to RM 45 per day and RM 60 for educational events.



Student helpers are given the opportunity be paid volunteers for events. They are paid **RM 50 / hour** for helping during various University events such as the convocation ceremony among others.
