In Malaysia, there are three categories of income groups:


- 1.Top 20% (T20) RM 11,820 and above
- 2.Middle 40% (M40) RM 5,250 RM 11,819
- **3.Bottom 40% (B40)** RM 5,249 and below

Various financial aids are made available for students from **bottom 40% household income** group to complete their studies. The aid is in the form of **rebates**, **education loan**, **scholarships**, and **bursary awards**.
